

Some hints for searching in Library Search

When searching for a **known title** in the new Library Search function, it is more efficient to use the "Starts with" option along with "In the title" Or by selecting the **Resource Guides** tab on the Library home page and selecting **Sciences**.



When you find the title you require, remember to click on the **Locations & Requests** tab to see if the item is on loan. Please note that "High use" items are located in the Reserve Collection.

When unsure of the exact title of an item, it is wise to use the "Advanced Search" option



Advanced Search gives more options for searching

This option gives you much more flexibility to search over different fields. You can enter a key author and any word that may be in the title.






