COURSES IN ADELAIDE

Adelaide University will, in future, hold examinations for two new degrees-Bachelor of Economics and Bachelor of Science in Forestry.

The annual meeting of the University Senate was held yesterday afternoon in the Prince of Wales lecture room at the University, with Mr. Justice Angas Parsons presiding.

The elections to the council and Senate resulted in the following appointments being made:-

late who passes as an executant with cre- A new clause was added to the regulations for the degree of Master of Arts. It was as follows:—"Candidates who had graduated as Bachelor of Arts in or before the year 1930, and who wished to proceed under the regulations already repealed, must apply to the council to have their position defined. In any case, all candidates proceeding under the regulations already repealed must complete the course not later than December, 1933."

Bachelor of Economics

A new degree, that of Bachelor of Economics, was added. Professor Wilton stated that there would be an ordinary and an honors degree. Candidates could obtain either or both.

Referring to the degree of Bachelor of Science, Professor Kerr Grant introduced a new clause for the degree of Bachelor of Science in Forestry. A candidate would complete a twoyears' course at the Australian Forestry School, Canberra. Before this, he would be required to attend the Adelaide University for two years.

Medical Students

Dr. de Crespigny informed the meeting of a revised regulation concerning medical students. He said that, at its discretion, the board might permit a candidate who had failed at the fifth examination in one group of subjects only, to present himself in that group of subjects only at the next examination, and if he satisfied the examiners in that group he should be deemed to have passed the whole examination. This was recommended and passed by the council.
