Second Cast Sings Well

There was a crowded house at Theatre-Royal last night to see the second cast appear in Vincent Wallace's popular light opera "Maritana," which is being presented by the Elder Conservatorium Opera Class under the direction of Mr. H. Winsice Hall, with Mr. Harold S. Denton

Improved Don Caesar

John Jonas sustained the part excel-lently last night. His acting was lifelike, and his voice, although still uncertain on the top notes, showed improvement on

previous performances.

Beryl Kekwick scored a well-deserved hit as Maritana. Her voice is perhaps the sweetest of all in the production. Histrionically she substitutes a certain charm and daintiness for the vivacity displayed by the Maritana in the first cast-Alison Lane. She was at her best in the favorite aria "Scenes That Are Brightest."

Evelvn Kekwick sang well as Lazarillo One of the most effective numbers of the evening was her duet with her sister, "O Sainted Mother."

As the villam Don Jose, Len McLaughlin did not quite come up to expectations Lack of stage experience probably handi capped him. However, he has a deep, resonant voice, and should do well.

Pleasing Voice

Lindsay Dawkins made the most of he part as the king, and the audierce showed its appreciation of his pleasing baritone Harold Porter as the marquis, Marjorie Hill as the marchioness, and Barold Burrows as captain of the guard were up

to standard.

The show went with more swing last night. Practically all the characters have found their feet, and the remaining performances tonight, tomorrow, and Friday should be well worth seeing. The ballet under Phyllis Leitch and the cherus, both of which have performed well from the start, were in good trim last night. costumes and scenery were as spectacular as usual.
