2000 ROCA AWARD OF MERIT

For the fortieth consecutive year, ROCA presented their "Award of Merit" to a notable Old Collegian who has provided meritorious and outstanding service to agriculture, Roseworthy Campus, ROCA and the community. The 2000 "Award of Merit" was presented to Grant Lester Paech (RDA 1960 0

Grant Paech is Managing Director of Beerenberg Pty, a Hahndorf based company manufacturing fine Australian jams, marmalade, honey, pickles, chutney and sauces. He is the fifth generation of German immigrant Johann Christian Paech to live and work on the same 95 hectare farm at Hahndorf.

Grant completed his studies at Roseworthy Agricultural College in 1960, taking over the family farm in 1970 following the passing of his father. In the years since 1970, Grant Paech has achieved a national and international profile for his products in this remarkable "rags to riches" story of a Roseworthy graduate.

In 1985/86, Grant won contracts to supply Ansett and Qantas airlines and a number of 5 star Australian hotels with his jam. A range of 14 gram foil pack jams was launched in 1993, aimed at the tourist hotel and airline markets.

Beerenberg still retains 70% of this part of the market, in addition to exporting to 24 Asian countries and 300 major 5 and 5 star hotels. The contribution made by Grant Paech to the national economy, agriculture and the community have been recognised widely. He has received the Jubilee Farm Management Award by the Farm Management Society, an Export Achievement Award, Award of Excellence for Regional Tourism and the Premier's Food & Fabric Award.

RULES GOVERNING THE ROCA AWARD OF MERIT

- 1. The Roseworthy Old Collegians Association (ROCA) shall periodically award a medal to a ROCA member who has mad a meritorious contribution in any field of agricultural activity and/or ROCA or community affairs. For the purpose of these rules, "agricultural activity" shall be given the widest possible meaning and will include all aspects of animal, land and natural resource management.
- 2. The award shall be considered annually and if in the opinion of the Selection Committee, there is no candidate of sufficient merit, no award shall be made.
- 3. a prospective candidate must be a ROCA member and the nomination shall be prepared and signed by two ROCA members. Nominations must be made on the Standard Form and must include the information required thereon.
- 4. Nominations with the supporting data must reach the ROCA Secretary by 30 June each year. The Executive shall review the nominations and have the right to reject any nomination deemed unsuitable before submitting the nominations to the Selection Committee.
- The Executive may, at its discretion, include for consideration any candidates previously nominated.
- 6. The Selection Committee shall consist of five members, one from each of the following fields:
 - primary production research and/or extension;
 - public service:
 - primary production;
 - agriculture related industry and
 - the President of ROCA.
- 7. The Executive shall appoint to the Selection Committee, such persons who are in their opinion of sufficient standing and experience to be competent to assess the merits of candidates from any field of agricultural activity. Membership of the Selection Committee will be reviewed by the Executive each year.
- 8. The President of ROCA shall be the Convenor of the Selection Committee and shall only have a casting vote. Three members of the selection Committee will constitute a guorum.
- 9. In the event of a member of the Executive or the selection Committee being proposed as a Candidate, that person will stand down from all discussions and deliberations for that year.
- The Selection Committee shall make its nomination to the Executive at least four weeks prior to the date of presentation of the award.
- 11. Members of the Executive and the Selection Committee are requested to hold the names of the candidates in strict confidence.

VALE – SIMON PITT (RDA 1956)

Simon James King Pitt (1934 - 2000), popularly known as "Bill", was a conscientious, cheerful and determined student and keen sportsman during his three years at RAC from 1954-56. Coming from his family property 'Glen Dhu', in Tasmania's Upper Derwent Valley, Simon understood better than many, the practical aspects of living on the land.

Upon graduating and returning to Tasmania, Simon put into practice the finer aspects of farming and grazing whilst managing an uncles property before rejoining the family partnership where he honed his acute stock breeding skills managing their extensive beef cattle and sheep enterprises. Then, with his wife Sandra and their three children to consider, he left the partnership to establish his own successful fine wool sheep flock and beef breeding herd on their property, "Stockwell", at Ouse. Despite this, he still found time to judge and assist with the livestock at regional shows and lead the volunteer fire service.

Simon was a strongly committed practical Christian. He actively led his community in worship and was instrumental in rebuilding the corner of their 150 year-old church, finding, quarrying and laying stone from the original quarry.

Simon died on 31st October 2000 after a battle with cancer. He will be remembered as a beloved and loving father and husband, for hias keen interest in rural affairs, his skills in farming and grazing, his significant contributions to the Anglican Church and his own upright, honest and God-fearing life.

Simon is survived by his wife Sandra, daughters Rebecca and Georgina and their families, and son Jonathan, now managing the home property.

VALE – NOEL ANTHONY BARRETT (RDA 1961)

Well known north-western NSW grazier Noel Anthony (Tony/Curly) Barrett passed away on 25th October 2000 in Narrabri Hospital after an 18 month battle with cancer. Tony grew up on the family property, "Yera" Edgeroi and was educated at Kings School in Sydney and Roseworthy Agricultural College in South Australia. His group of very strong Roseworthy friends remained with him for the rest of his life, with some travelling to his funeral and many calling to see him during his illness.

Only last October, Tony and Robyn travelled to Adelaide to attend the 40th Anniversary of his graduation. Tony wanted the opportunity to renew old friendships, as this was a very important part of his life.

After completing his course at Roseworthy, Tony worked in south Australia on several properties before returning to his home state. Prior to managing the family properties, "Yera" and "Manamoi", he jackarooed at a number of properties in North Western NSW, including "Gurley Station" and "Gunyerwarildi". He also worked for the late Ken Kirkby at "Koiwon" Bellata and on "Willowlee" in the Watercourse country west of Moree during the 1965 drought, gaining a wide range of experience in farming and stock management.

Tony returned to "Yera" in 1967 and married Robyn Whitfeld of Bingara in may 1968. Wheat dominated the farm's production for the first 25 years, with cattle breeding playing a secondary role. In 1993, Tony and Robyn decided to concentrate solely on cattle, which allowed Tony to indulge in his great love of horses, cattle and dogs.

Tony contributed to the local community in many different ways, often inconspicuously and always in the gentlemanly manner for which he was noted. He was a director of the Narrabri Rural Lands Protection Board until the time of his passing, diligently attending meetings even when obviously very unwell. He was an active member of NSW Farmers and held several executive positions.

Earlier he was Chairman of the NSW Graziers Association and he took a major advisory role in the development of the Chemical Residues Act. He was also inaugural Chairman of the Narrabri Trees on Farms committee.

Tony was a great lover of all sports, as both a player and as a spectator, giving 100% in everything he did. He took up boxing at boarding school, to compensate for his (then) slight build and became the Kings School Flyweight Champion. Tony had a passion for Rugby Union and Australian Rules, playing both codes simultaneously for the three years before he retired at age 40. Tony is survived by his wife Robyn, son Andrew and daughters Belinda, Suzy and Felicity.


For those not playing golf, you may wish to take in some of the local sights during the day, or walk around the course. We look forward to a good roll-up of Old Collegians at this function.
