You also raise a question in your email about the Roseworthy Campus farming land located to the east of Wasleys Road, and rumours surrounding this since the release of the Government's Greater Adelaide 30-Year Plan. While the University is very interested in ensuring the well planned future development of the areas around the Roseworthy Campus, we have no intention of selling any of the associated farm land or the land on which the Campus is built. We believe that Roseworthy Campus has a strong future as a University campus and we expect enrolments to grow into the future.

Roseworthy Campus & Student Fund

Representatives of the Co-Patrons met recently with Professor James Mc Wha Vice Chancellor of the University of Adelaide to discuss possible financial assistance for the Fund following sale of the various University owned properties. We were assured significant sums would be made available for the benefit of students and so we are hopeful the Campus & Student Fund will be one of the beneficiaries.

Our objective is to have a minimum of \$100,000 invested with the University's composite fund so that at least \$5,000 are available each year for a scholarship which is comparable with others on offer. Currently only about \$40,000 are invested which reflect a rather luke-warm and disappointing response from donors considering that there are many very worthwhile and enthusiastic students needing assistance. I urge all ROCA members to seriously consider helping the fund and supporting the considerable efforts of all co-patrons.

Congratulations are due to early winners of the various scholarships who have performed particularly well. It is very pleasing to know that the scholarships have facilitated successful outcomes for those students who have finished their initial courses.

The first recipient of the Trevor Dillon Scholarship, Brendan Wallace, completed his studies in the Bachelor of Agriculture at the end of 2009 and graduated at the graduation ceremony held in April 2010. Brendan is now working in the area of grain trading with the Rural Directions at Freeling.

Luke Doecke, the first recipient of the Royal Agricultural & Horticultural Scholarship also graduated in April this year with a Bachelor of Agriculture and is working with a horticultural and irrigation company in the Riverland.

The first recipient of the Roseworthy Campus & Student Fund Scholarship, Alexandra Fowler, has recently commenced study for her Honours after completing an Animal Science Degree.

The more recent Scholarship recipients continue to perform admirably in their programs of study with the next group Brendan Voss (Campus & Student Fund winner) and Cindy Martin (winner of the Royal Agricultural & Horticultural Society scholarship) expecting to complete their studies in the Bachelor of Science (Animal Science) and the Bachelor of Agriculture respectively at the end of this year.
