NEWS FROM THE COLLEGE

- 1. News Tractors As a result of generous donations from the Australian Wheat Board, the College now owns 2 Belarus tractors. One is a Belarus 920, a 90 hp, 4-wheel drive (front wheel assist), and the other is a Belarus 1770, 150 hp articulated equal 4-wheel drive. The 920 was handed over officially to the College during the 1987 Farmers Day programme by Mr Bob McCarthy, Deputy General Manager of the Australian Wheat Board and in the presence of Old Collegian John Dawkins, Minister for Trade.
- 2. News Buildings After many lean years the College has embarked on a period of very welcome building construction. The new graphic communication centre has been completed. Work has started on a new Small Animal House. Work is expected to start early in January on extensions to the agricultural Engineering Building and the major project, a new Agriculture Building with lecture and tutorial rooms, laboratories and offices, will get under way about mid 1987. Extensions to the Community Club will be completed in time for College pre-Christmas functions.
- News Administration The College will commence 1987 ith a new Academic Administrative Structure involving a livision of Wine Science and a Division of Land Management.

Trangements are in train to appoint a new Head of the Division of Wine Science following the retirement of Dr B.C. Cankine. The new appointee also will be Head of the Department of Wine Science. Within the Division of Land Canagement will be 3 Academic Departments — Commercial and Cocial Sciences, Agricultural Technology, and Land Resources Canagement — with 2 Faculties — Agriculture and Natural Casources — being responsible for course matters.

V.R. Squires has accepted appointment as Head of the ivision of Land Management and Mr K.J. Edwards has accepted interest as Deputy Head of the Division of Land Management Dean of the Faculty of Agriculture.
