LAYING THE FOUNDATION STONE

OF THE

ELDER CONSERVATORIUM,

MONDAY, 26TH SEPTEMBER, 1898.

PROGRAMME.

The Foundation Stone of the Elder Conservatorium on North Terrace, Adelaide, will be laid by His Excellency the Governor (Visitor of the University), on Monday, 26th September, 1898, at 3 p.m.

The Orchestra of the Conservatorium will play an overture at 2.45 p.m. The National Anthem will be played on the arrival of the Governor, who will be received at the entrance by the Chancellor, Vice-Chancellor, Warden of the Senate, and Registrar, and attended by them to the seats reserved for the Vice-Regal Party.

The Chancellor will request His Excellency to lay the Foundation Stone. The Architect will present a trowel to the Governor, who will lay the stone, and deliver an Address.

The Honourable the Minister Controlling Education will then address the Meeting.

After the conclusion of the Minister's Address, the Assembly will sing the National Anthem. His Excellency will then be accompanied to the entrance by the Chancellor, Vice-Chancellor, Warden of the Senate, and Registrar, and will retire, the Orchestra playing a March.

Those who are to receive the Governor are requested to assemble not later than 2.45 p.m.

All Graduates are requested to wear Academic dress, as prescribed by the Regulations printed in the Calendar. Members of the Council, and Professors who are not Graduates, are requested to wear ordinary Academic robes.
