## S.A. Secedes From Commonwealth

# I.C. POWER GRAB SHOCK

ADELAIDE, Today: It is believed by official sources that the Premier (Sir Thomas Playford) will formally announce the secession of South Australia from the Commonwealth today. (Adelaide Liberated by the Libs.).

Bitter fighting has been reported along the Victorian border when South Australian troops infiltrated Commonwealth lines in gun-carriages disguised as John Martin's Procession floats. It was later revealed by a spokesman for John Martin's that floats had been requisitioned from them by the Playford Government for military purposes.

At a press conference after the Premier's return from a recent Loan Council meeting, Sir Thomas declined to comment on the alleged proposed declaration of South Australia as an independent nation. He also refused explanation for the recall of all South Australian Federal Parliamentarians from Surfers' Paradise where they have been involved in important Government busi-

Observers observing the Premier's departure from the West Eeach Airport, claim that before boarding the official steam-roller, he was heard to mutter sounds re-sembling "... that bleeding bathtub Menzies!"

Official sources have suggested that a somewhat strained relationship may ex-ist between the Premier and the Prime Minister (Mr.

Later, in Parliament, when asked by the Leader of the Opposition (Mr. Walsh), if there was any truth in the rumour that South Australia was to become an indepen-dent nation, the Premier re-plied that he was not in complete aquaintance with the situation, but Members could be assured that the Government was in complete control. When reporters later attempted to interview Mr. Walsh they were in-

formed that he had left Adelaide for Port Augusta, where he will assume control of the Electricity Trust's munitions plant in that area. It is thought that the new Leader of the Opposition will be Sir Baden Pattinson, our ex-Minister for Educa-

## New Element Discovered

Scientists throughou. the world are elated by the discovery of a new element which they have already assigned the common name "Woman." It will bear the symbol "Wm."

The accepted weight of the most abundant isomer (isomers are different forms of the same element) is 120 but rare ones are found between 65 and 400. The latter have an uninteresting and short half-life.

#### Occurrence

It is abundant in nature and can be found in both free and combined states, usually associated with an attacking species.

#### Physical Properties

A number of different forms have been observed. Their transparency, hard-ness, colour and boiling point all vary within a wide range. The colour exhibited by many specimens is only a surface phenomenon and is due to a closely adherent powder which can be scraped off by specialised techniques. Un polished specimens tend to turn

green in the presence of highly polished ones. The boiling point of some isomers is quite low while others forcing conditions.


### University Decentralised

It is not an exhortation. Possibly it is a sermon. If you wish to remain in ignorance as to why there is a Prosh Day read no further. But if you wish to be enlightened, read on.

Today is one of the most important occasions of the University year. We have fun and we invite you to share in it with us. It is not a day when the decadence of modern youth is bared to the public eye. On the contrary, in our opinion, this is the day that the future leaders of the community can display some of their talents to advantage and raise money for Charities at the same time. Some may doubt and criticise this statement and they may complain bitterly that no good can come out of a University. They regard youth as an "atrocious crime" and something to be called to heel when it becomes aroused, but they conveniently forget that this same youth may be called on to guide and ayard them in times to come as it has in times past. We expect, nay we welcome, honest criticism. What we do not welcome is petty sniping and "sour grapes." Fortunately these will only come from a small section of the public who have not attempted to adjust themselves to a changing world. There may be actions by students and even articles in this paper that could be regarded as questionable. We make no excuses for them, for as Pope said, "An excuse is worse and more terrible than a lie; for an excuse is a lie guarded"; we only ask that you be fair.



This has caused alarm on the Pacific Seaboard in America and already the large cities of San Francisco and Los Angeles have been evacuated. The President has declared a state of National Emergency and has been in touch with the Heads of free countries in an attempt to raise a U.N. force to repel the invaders.

The President said, "As in World War II, we are ready to fight to the death (of all


