Widow guards grisly graves

WASHINGTON—An American woman yesterday lost a three year long battle against Kansas state authorities to declare her front garden a nuclear free zone.

Kansas police claimed the woman picketed the local senator's office for more than five weeks last year to place a ban on any nuclear material passing within a fifty mile radius of her neatly ordered front garden.

When recently asked why she began her courageous but lonely campaign against the establishment, Mrs Mary Perry, 57, shockingly claimed her front lawn was a mass grave of her late husband's murder victims, and

she wished no more damage to come to their decomposed bodies.

On being offered an equitable solution to the three year old dispute by Kansas state authorities which agreed in essence to remove the bodies from the yard, the lady refused, saying:

"The bodies must not be touched. That would be an unforgivable and unchristian action. Besides the decomposed bodies have done marvels for my lawn."

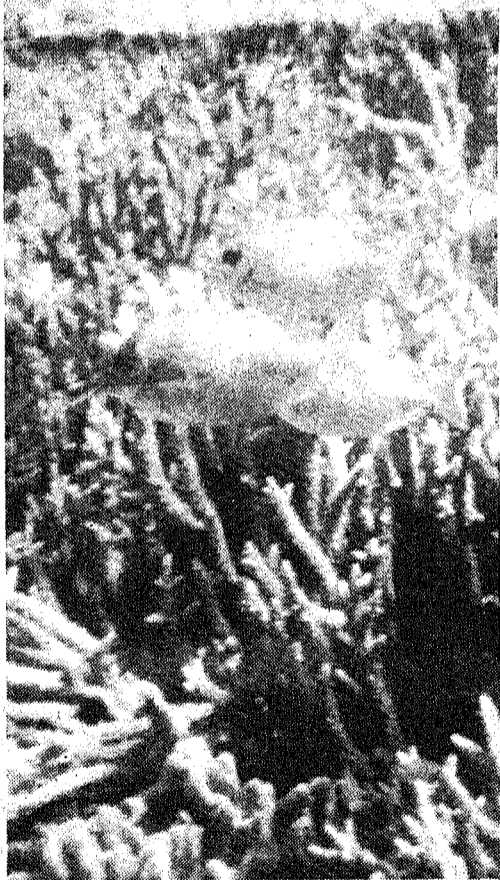

Bjelke shock-damn the reef

Queensland Premier Joe Bjelke-Paterson announced on Saturday in Brisbane that his administration was looking at plans to dam the Great Barrier Reef. Speaking at a luncheon held by the Extremely-Right-Wing-To-Hell-With-Freedom Club, Mr Bjelke-Paterson said that Queensland was never going to be behind other Australian states in the environmental field.

"I think it's obvious," said the Premier, "that Tasmania is perceived as a definite leader in the area of ecological vandalism. Every patriotic Queenslander should be worried at the way our state has lagged

behind in this sphere recently. It is for this reason that I have decided to support the proposed Barrier Reef Dam which is presently under consideration in Cabinet."

"Conditions for building such a dam in Queensland are ideal. For a start, we won't have to worry about protest marches by any namby-pamby environmentalists. I would like to point out that my Government has an unequalled record of suppression for free speech, and I intend to maintain that record."

Asked later what the practical benefits of the proposed scheme would be, Mr Bjelke-Paterson said that vicious attacks on his ideals were clear signs that the creeping malaise of Communism was reviving in Australia. Questioned as to the proposed cost of the dam, the Premier said that it was time for all the whingeing liberal thinkers to realise who was in control and shut up. Otherwise, he sug-

gested, he'd send his big fat friend and his boys round to "shake things up a bit".

"What you've got to realise is that every dolphin on the Reef is in fact just as rich as an Arab oil Sheik. I don't know why they aren't satisfied with this, but I think it demonstrates that nobody has any cause to complain at what we intend to do. Of course, we can always lock up anybody who makes too much noise."

In Canberra, the Prime Minister, Mr Razor, said that he'd have to examine the proposals but expressed a reluctance to interfere with state matters. The Leader of the Opposition (whoever he is) didn't have anything to say when we contacted him at 3.00am yesterday.

Mr Bjelke-Paterson, who is patron of the ERW-THWFC, stepped from the podium to tumultuous applause. The Club President, Mr I.M. Hittler, said later that Mr Bjelke-Paterson would go down in history as one of Queensland's great leaders. "This is a great day for fascists ... eh, patriots everywhere," he said.

The mutilated remains of the tiny child were littered with competition and give away slips. All of the body organs were discovered, except, mysteriously, the brain.

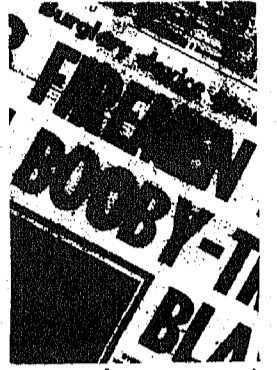
A distraught eye witness claims to have seen the tabloid, with gaping headlines and blood dripping sandals stalk the tiny boy in an inner city suburb.

Adelaide University students have committed the funds raised in Prosh Week to the Aboriginal Community College.

For over one year the eleven teaching staff and eighty odd students of the college have been trying to move from their cramped quarters in Brougham Place, North Adelaide, to more spacious buildings and grounds at Largs Bay.

"If we get sufficient money from Prosh then that money alone could make the difference between us moving or not," says Mr Ken Petrie, the college principal.

The Largs Bay site has been offered to the college by the Sisters of St Joseph who formerly ran an orphanage there. However, opposition from the Port Adelaide Council on planning grounds, saw the case taken first to the Planning Appeals Board and then to the Supreme Court, which ruled in the college's favour in April this year.

Having won the legal battle to move, the college has now found that it cannot raise the

money. The Commonwealth Government, which funds the college through the Department of Aboriginal Affairs, will not support the move because the college is expected to be moving to a disused primary school in Port Adelaide in 1984.

However the students themselves and the eleven person all-Aboriginal controlling council of the college, are "very keen" to move to Largs Bay now, according to Mr Petrie.

Apart from the vast improvement in space, cheaper rental and better facilities, the legal victory (over the Port Council) is seen as very important by the Aboriginal community, and the feeling is that it should be put into effect, Mr Petrie said.

The college has approached "various church agencies" seeking funds, and Mr Petrie said that the Sisters of St Joseph (who have already lost more than a year and a half's rental on the Largs Bay site) were "continuing to be very patient and supportive". The college estimates that it needs \$10,600

to cover the move to Largs Bay, but Mr Petrie reiterated that \$5,000 would probably move the college at this stage of the year.

Last year about \$6,000 was raised during Prosh for the Multiple Sclerosis Society.

Mr Petrie said that the college's council was "very pleased" to hear of the Prosh commitment, and his own reaction was "the whole thing's terrific".

generosity.

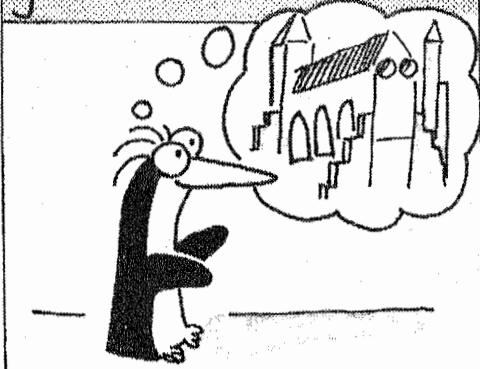
So, these trials and
