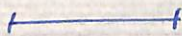

"About eight years ago, while a midshipman on board Her Majesty's sloop Raleigh, I had the pleasure of visiting them, the Raleigh having been sent from India for that express purpose; we found residing on the largest island of the group about forty-five men, women and children, the chief part of the men being British subjects, and the two principal settlers men-of-war's men: the women were all natives of the Sandwich Islands."

Obtain report of HMS Raleigh; also account of Beechey's visit; and try to locate all other accounts of this settlement.
