The word "Acts" is used to include Governors' Ordinances and Proclamations in addition to Acts of the Executive and Legislative Councils. Despite the use of the term "Ordinance", many papers from 1926 are unbound and packed in boxes.

India Office

Most manuscript material on the Pacific will be found in the India Office records, 1600-1858, contain a mass of information on the East India Company in relation to the development of whaling and trade in the Pacific area up to the date of the abolition of the Company's monopoly in 1834.

This will be found scattered among the:-

- (1) COURT MINUTES, most volumes being indexed (though not always adequately) in addition to two series of general indexes (1790-1827, and 1813-1858);
- (2) MISCELLANEOUS LETTERS RECEIVED (195 vols., indexed to 1827) an analysis of the Company's in-letters; and
- (3) MISCELLANIES (118 vols, partially indexed and with a separate index series from 1805), the out-letters.

FOREIGN OFFICE.

The majority of the Foreign Office papers in the P.R.O. belong to the two classes General Correspondence of the Foreign Office and Embassy and Consular Records Archives. The General Correspondence consists mainly of original despatches and reports from British diplomatic and consular representatives abroad, correspondence with foreign missions in England, miscellaneous correspondence with individuals and drafts or copies of letters sent from the Office. It is arranged mostly alphabetically under the name of the Foreign State concerned until the end of 1905, and thereafter under the subject headings Africa, Commercial, Consular, Contraband, Dominions, Information, Library, News, Political, Prisoners and Treaty. The Embassy and Consular Archives are complimentary to the General Correspondence, comprising the archives of the British diplomatic missions and consular establishments overseas, arranged in alphabetical order.

There is likely to be a great deal more material in these files relating to the affairs of the Pacific Islands than is apparent from the catalogues and ~~the~~ lists. These are drawn up without much detail, and in general only refer to the Pacific Islands in cases where Great Britain has had diplomatic or consular representatives there. All the diplomatic exchanges between London and Paris, London and Madrid, etc., relating to Pacific affairs will be found in the files coming under the heading of the foreign State concerned, and to this there is no short cut, though the confidential prints give some indication of the nature and volume of the material. Attention is therefore directed to the headings: America, United States; France; Germany; Holland, and Netherlands; Spain, etc.

Apart from these two main classes, the rest of the F.O. material is classified under:

Treaties, Archives of Commission, Confidential Prints, Chief Clerk's Department, Passport Office, Peace Conference of 1919-1920, War of 1939-1945, Miscellaneous and Private Collections.
