When interrogated on the subject of a Western Australian University, Mr. Hodge said the matter had not been discussed in Adelaide, but he considered that Western Australia, except from a financial standpoint, was in a better position than Adelaide was when her University was established.

MUSIC EXAMS.

S.A. Professors

Visiting the West

ADELAIDE, This Day.—Dr. Ennis, a professor of music, and C. R. Hodge the registrar of Adelaide University, left by the R.M.S. Orotava to-day for Westralia.

They are going across to make arrangements for the new examinations in music, which have lately been instituted by the Universities of Melbourne and Adelaide, and which will come into operation next year in Adelaide.

The universities are already conducting theoretical examinations in music in the West, but so far practical examiners have not visited that State.

Messrs. Ennis and Hodge will make arrangements to remedy this.

Among the passengers by the R.M.S. Orotava, which reached Fremantle this afternoon, were Professor Ennis and Mr. C. R. Hodge, registrar of the Adelaide University. Professor Ennis is Doctor of Music at the Adelaide Conservatorium, and the Chamber Concerts organised by him have had an appreciable effect in raising the musical standard in the southern State. Mrs. Ennis also a talented musician. She is passionately fond of animals, and last year she reconstituted the Adelaide Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals by undertaking the secretarial work, but she was compelled to relinquish the secretaryship after about six months of honorary service, which placed the society once more on a working footing.

PERSONAL.

Professor Ennis and Mr. C. B. Hodge, the registrar of the Adelaide University, will arrive to-day by the Orotava. They are coming over here to make arrangements for the examination in music which the Adelaide and Melbourne Universities intend to hold next year, and a meeting of teachers of music will be called in a few days, at which Professor Ennis will explain exactly what the Universities intend doing. The arrangement by which the Associated Board of the Royal Academy and Royal College of Music conduct the practical examination for the Adelaide University ceases at the end of this year.

MUSICAL EXAMINATIONS.

THE NEW SCHEME.

Dr. Ennis and Mr. C. B. Hodge, Professor of Music and Registrar of the University of Adelaide respectively, arrived in Perth yesterday by the R.M.S. Orotava. The principal object of Dr. Ennis's visit is to explain the new scheme of public examinations in music projected by the Universities of Adelaide and Melbourne, and to arrange the necessary details for giving effect to them in this State. In conversation with a representative of this journal last night, Mr. Hodge explained that advantage had been taken of the opportunity afforded by the Jubilee celebrations of the Melbourne University, held in April last, for the delegations from the other Australian and the New Zealand Universities to discuss the advisability of placing these examinations upon a uniform basis, Melbourne and Adelaide came to a definite agreement to co-operate in such a way as to bring about the much required uniformity so far as Victoria and South Australia were concerned. Besides this, a scheme was drafted and submitted to the general conference of all the universities there represented. Not only was the principle embodied in the scheme approved by the general conference, but that body carried the following resolution—

"That co-operation between the universities of the Commonwealth and New Zealand in the conduct of public examinations in music is desirable, such co-operation to be on the general lines of the proposed agreement between the Universities of Melbourne and Adelaide adopted at a conference held in Melbourne on April 25."

It is possible, therefore, that before very long these examinations, which are becoming more important each succeeding year, will be so conducted as to ensure uniformity in standard, method, diploma, and so forth. Whether this shall ever be so or not, some approach to uniformity will be made in the two States named and in Tasmania and Western Australia, which, in this connection, are affiliated with them. Mr. Hodge did not consider himself at liberty to discuss the details of the local operations contemplated just yet, as the whole scheme in all its details and bearings is to be debated in the course of a day or two by a conference between the two gentlemen from Adelaide and the University Extension Committee of this city. Arrangements will then be made for the holding of examinations under the new agreement, which is to come into practical effect at the beginning of next year.

Mr. Hodge will not confine himself solely, or even principally, to matters relating to music, but will see what can be done to improve the system under which the affiliation of the Perth Technical School to the Adelaide University works in its practical operation. The magnitude of the work done under this affiliation has grown considerably, and the organisation, which was found sufficient to bear the strain when it was brought about, now needs enlarging and strengthening. It will be his business to attend to this important matter as soon as the new musical arrangements are completed, and, as it is absolutely necessary for him to return to South Australia by next week's mail steamer, he is likely to have his hands full all the time he is in Perth.

UNIVERSITY EXTENSION

JOINT EXAMINATION SCHEME.

Professor Ennis and Mr. C. R. Hodge, registrar of the Adelaide University, reached Fremantle by the R.M.S. Orotava this afternoon. They were met by a "Daily News" reporter, and in response to an inquiry as to the object of their visit, Mr. Hodge said, "As you are aware the University of Adelaide has conducted examinations on behalf of Western Australia in theory and practice of music for about eight years past, but latterly the examinations have been conducted in conjunction with the associated board. This year, the agreement with the associated board expires by effluxion of time. From the beginning of 1907 the University of Adelaide in co-operation with the University of Melbourne, will make joint examinations in theory and practice. This co-operation of the two Universities may be regarded as the nucleus of an Association of Australasian Universities. The scheme of co-operation between Adelaide and Melbourne was approved at a conference of Australasian Universities held in Melbourne in April last, and the conference carried a further resolution affirming the desirability of a scheme in which all the Australasian Universities should
