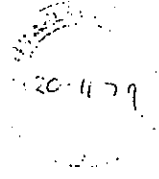

## SUMMARY

Twenty published contributions are submitted on the taxonomy and distribution of insects of the Order Hemiptera - suborder Heteroptera, mostly covering the Australian fauna as a whole but two are restricted to the fauna of South Australia, whereas several others cover the fauna of certain groups in both Australia and regions surrounding Australia. One additional contribution is presented on the fauna of several groups of insects of the New Hebrides and discusses the composition and origin of this fauna. Fifteen of these twenty one contributions are placed as an Appendix (C) at the end of this first volume and the last six are placed in a companion volume (Vol. II) as Appendix D.

This volume includes a 44 page set of introductory sections for the more general reader on the background, scope and intent of these published contributions.

An Appendix A of 27 pages follows which lists the titles, dates and journal of publication of the twenty one contributions together with a discussion of the significance and scope of each paper and notes any follow-up work on the groups which they treated by any authors, including this author.

Appendix C contains a copy of two German language reviews of the two largest contributions, together with an English language translation of each.
