## COMMEMORATION DAY.

The University of Adelaide held its commemoration day celebrations in the Elder Hall on Wednesday afternoon in the presence of a large assemblage of the public. The Chancellor (Sir Samuel Way) presided and many others who occupied seats on the platform were his Excellency the Governor, the Vice-Chancellor (Dr. Barlow), and members of the University senate, council, and professorial staff. All the gentlemen entitled to wear academic robes did so. In the body of the hall was a large gathering of ladies and gentlemen, including Lady Le Hunte. The ladies, as usual, predominated. The undergraduates, as a body, took no part in the proceedings in consequence of a demand by the council that they should submit their programme to delegates, to be nominated by the council. A few of the students, however, occupied seats at the back of the hall, and gave vent to occasional remarks of a more or less humorous nature. Once or twice they apparently thought the Chancellor would not prove equal to the task of pronouncing the names of some of the candidates for degrees, for they took it upon themselves to chant in chorus the full Christian and surnames of these gentlemen as they stepped forward to receive their degrees. In Sir Samuel Way's hands, generally speaking, however, excellent order was maintained, and whenever any of the speakers was interrupted in his remarks it was not the students alone, but the entire audience that joined in the burst of applause which followed some pointed allusion or comment upon the successful career of a candidate.

The Chancellor, after welcoming his Excellency, proceeded to confer the degrees upon the successful candidates. These were as follow:—

### Law.
