QUIET COMMEMORATION DAY.

The ceremony in connection with the presentation of the degrees won at the Adelaide University, which was held in the Elder Hall on Monday afternoon, was the quietest for years. From about half to three-quarters of the seats in the hall were occupied. Except those who had to attend to obtain their degrees there were no undergraduates present, because they had decided that, as they could not obtain admission on the conditions they demanded, they would not attend at all. Therefore the proceedings lacked the animation which had characterized those at which the students' programme had been presented. The Chancellor of the University (Sir Samuel Way, Bart.) presided. His Excellency the Governor (Sir George Le Hunte) was present. The members of the senate and council assembled in the concert room, and marched to Elder Hall in the following order:—The Clerk of the Senate, Bachelors of Music, Bachelors of Science, Bachelors of Arts, Bachelors of Medicine, Bachelors of Laws, Masters of Arts, Doctors of Music, Doctors of Science, Doctors of Medicine, Doctors of Laws, Warden of the Senate, Teachers of the Elder Conservatorium, Acting Director, Lecturers of the University, Professors of the University, Registrar, Council, Vice-Chancellor, and Chancellor.
