

- 1. To give every new member an opportunity to participate in the activities of the group.
- 2. To simplify the casting of the two three-act plays scheduled for the Second Term.

One of these three-act plays will represent Adelaide in the Australian Universities Drama Festival, to be held at the Tivoli in August.

The Student Theatre Group will be working in conjunction with a special Drama Festival Committee, and would appreciate the co-operation of its members, indeed of all people, in ensuring the success of this outstanding dramatic event.
