ALBERT AND VICTORIA

Some years ago, the Guild staged another play taken from Laurence Housman's "Happy and Glorious." It dealt with the initiation of Victoria as a girl and very young woman into the office of Queen. *QUEEN'S CONSORT* is concerned with the relations, public and private, between the young Queen and the foreign Prince who was her husband. The play is not primarily about Queen Victoria; it is about Albert and Victoria.

Victoria came to the throne in 1837. She and Albert were both 21 when they were married in 1840. The Prince died in 1861. It was only after his death that his adopted country began slowly to realize the profound influence for good he had been in education, agriculture, industry, the science of government and art.

THE PLAY

Laurence Housman's dramatic biography consists of a large number of short plays. Historically informative, the little plays are theatrically effective and always entertaining. They are "good theatre." For this production the episodes have been selected and combined to form what a few years ago would have been called a "chronicle play" of mounting interest.
