cial problem with success in the early days of the war, settled strike after strikes, overcame the difficulty about munitions, and in the teeth of fierce opposition, brought all the armies of the Allies under one supreme command. Great, too, is the value of competent direction in industrial affairs. There are plenty of laboring men who believe honestly that it is they who create wealth, and that management has little to do with it. The history of the revolution in Russia is teaching the world something very different in his admirable lecture on "The Humanizing of industry" Mr. Gerald Mussen, speaking of the smelters at Port Pirie, told us that "if a committee of workmen owned the smelters and ran them, and, say, twenty experts were withdrawn, the production of lead would probably not total more than 10,000 tons a year. If the twenty experts then returned and took charge with exactly the same plant and exactly the same labor force their production would be what it is at present—about 150,000 tons a year." This will be hard reading for the rank and file of labor in Australia to-day; but it will not surprise the historian who re-

CHAS. R. HODGE, Registrar of the University of Adelaide, appears for the defence:—

The BULLETIN of December 18 castigates the Council of the University of Adelaide in regard to the recent appointment of Dr. COLEMAN PHILLIPSON as professor of law because he is not an Australian. Kindly allow the following facts on the other side to appear for the information of readers, who will then probably endorse the action of the Council:—

(1) Applications were invited by advertisement in the Australian States as well as in England.
 (2) Fifteen applications were received. The University Council considered the whole of them, and made the appointment which in its absolute judgment was the best. In so doing it had the advantage of the assistance of an advisory committee composed of Adelaide lawyers with the exception of one.

(3) In addition to the professor there are lecturers in practical subjects in the Law School, who are all selected from the profession in Adelaide.

(4) During the current year the University has appointed six professors:—Dr. HAROLD DAVIES, to the chair of music; Dr. J. R. WILSON, mathematics; Dr. BRADSHAW ROBERTSON, physiology; Dr. J. BURTON CLELAND, pathology; Dr. F. WOOD-JONES, anatomy; and Dr. COLEMAN PHILLIPSON, law. The first three are graduates of Adelaide, and Dr. CLELAND, Adelaide born, completed three years of his medical course here, but, in consequence of the unfortunate "hospital trouble" in the 'nineties, he, with others, went to Sydney, where he graduated. Of the six men appointed four may be regarded as graduates of the University, showing the Council's "wisdom of preference for its own graduates." In regard to the other appointments, the Council feels that the University is to be, and shortly will be, congratulated on having added to its teaching staff such distinguished men as Dr. WOOD-JONES and Dr. PHILLIPSON.

Yes, it is not a bad record. In most studies the Council seems to be satisfied that Australian Universities can train their own teachers. Why not also in Law? Is the teaching there less satisfactory than in the others? If it is it is singularly unfortunate, because, whereas Mathematics, for instance, are the same all the world over, Law is not the same in any two countries, and it is therefore particularly desirable that in this subject our teachers' should be home products.

More Stinking Fish.

ADELAIDE University furnishes the latest instance of the importing mania. A Professor of Law at £800 per annum was required to fill the vacancy caused by the appointment of Dr. JETHRO BROWN as President of the

local Industrial Court. BROWN resigned three years ago, and since then the work of the Professor of Law has been carried on by temporary lecturers appointed from amongst graduates in private practice in Adelaide. The employment of these practising lawyers as lecturers had the great advantage of bringing the law students into contact with the atmosphere of the law courts and the actual problems of everyday practice. How great an advantage this is every member of the legal profession in Adelaide who has sat under Dr. BROWN realised as soon as he left the Uni.; for JETHRO BROWN, whatever his merits as a writer of readable books on political economy, had never practised at the Bar at all, and consequently filled his students with speculations and theories instead of legal facts. There has been a whisper that he would at one time have been glad to get rid of his worries at the Industrial Court and go back to the placid life of a professor, but that he received no encouragement from the Uni. authorities, because it was considered that a more practical man was required. At any rate applications were called for the position—called in Australia and England—and a Dr. PHILLIPSON, of Manchester, has just been appointed. The new professor's special recommendation seems to be that he is a great authority on Public International Law. For all the use this is likely to be to a prospective S. Australian lawyer he might as well be an authority on the functions of clothes-pegs. There is nothing in the biographical particulars available concerning him to suggest that he has any more practical experience as a lawyer than JETHRO BROWN, and he certainly does not appear to have had anything like BROWN's experience as a lecturer in legal subjects. Besides, BROWN was an Australian and had knowledge of Australian law and Australian conditions; it is not suggested that PHILLIPSON has either. He has to commence his lectures next year. But how is it possible for him in the meantime to acquire knowledge of the extent to which English law has been modified in Australia by statute and precedent—knowledge which he ought to have to qualify him to lecture to Australian students? How much, for example, is he likely to know by then about South Australian Acts, or the principles of Constitutional Law as developed by the High Court? Adelaide Uni. had a great opportunity to render the education it offered to its law students more efficient, and also to do honor to one of its distinguished graduates in law. It has chosen instead to cry stinking fish. If an Australian University cannot be brought to see the wisdom of preference for its own graduates, or at least the graduates of Australian Universities, how can the unenlightened business man be expected to prefer the product of the same universities
