April 24, 1917, and was abroad till March 2, 1919. His University career had been distinguished, as he had secured first-class honors in four subjects and second-class in the other two.
 Mr. Ziesing is a son of Mr. Ziesing, of Henley Beach-road, Mile-End. He received his education at the Christian Brothers' College.
 Mr. P. E. Johnstone moved for the admission of Mr. E. L. Stevens, who had had a brilliant academic career, and had secured a first-class pass in every law subject except one, for which he had sat. In his final year he had the distinction of winning the David Murray Scholarship and the Stow Scholarship. To gain the latter it was necessary that the winner should have secured the Stow prize on three occasions.
 Mr. Stevens is the fifth son of the late Mr. C. J. Stevens, an Adelaide journalist. He was educated at State schools, and at the Adelaide High School, before entering the University.
 Mr. G. McEwin moved for the admission of Mr. A. S. H. Gifford. He mentioned that Mr. Gifford was articled in 1913. In January, 1916, he enlisted for active service, and served in the forces for three years in the 3rd Australian Divisional Signalling Company. While a sergeant he received the D.C.M. He believed he was the first South Australian qualified practitioner who had the distinction. He also received his commission while on the field.
 Mr. Gifford is a son of the Rev. Alfred Gifford (pastor of the North Adelaide Congregational Church), and is 22 years of age. He received his education at P.A.C., where he won the Colton and the Robb scholarships.
 All the applicants were admitted. They signed the roll and took the customary oaths.
 Congratulations.
 The Chief Justice, in congratulating the newly-admitted men, said they all had something to be proud of in their careers. Mr. Stevens had won great distinction at the University. The others had the great honor of having served with the Australian forces in the war. It was no doubt a misfortune to them in some ways that they should have been obliged to sacrifice the experience which the full service of their articles would have given them. He felt confident, however, that the fine character and determination they had shown in going to the front would make up for the disabilities they had been under. Success in the legal profession would not depend entirely on the high standards of their past examinations. It would depend greatly on character and hard work. It was not always the men of genius who succeeded in the law. He thought the great flight which had just been completed had some lessons for them. They should look after their health, and see that the machine was kept in good order. They must exercise foresight, and not overlook anything. If they observed those hints he had no doubt they would all be successful. They were starting new machines, and even then might get out of order. They were entering an honorable profession in which they would be trusted with the fortunes and reputations of others, and it would be their duty to see that they did the best they could by all lawful means. He wished them a successful and prosperous career.

UNIVERSITY COUNCIL.
 A meeting of the council of the University of Adelaide was held on Friday. There were present the Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Professor Rennie), Mr. Brookman, the Hon. F. S. Wallis, Sir Joseph Verec, Mr. Caterer, Mr. Chapple, Dr. Poniton, Mr. Maughan, Professor Perkins, Professor Chapman, Dr. Hayward, Dr. H. Mayo, and Messrs. Talbot Smith. The council had before it Mr. S. Talbot Smith. The council had before it a report from the subcommittee, together with a report from the proposed new medical buildings. The plans were approved, and it was resolved to empower the architect to prepare specifications and call for tenders. The council resolved to create a lectureship in public health and preventive medicine, and to invite applications for the position, and also to invite applications for lecturers in the dental course in dental materia medica, and dental therapeutics, and dental mechanics, and dental presentation to the University of an address in connection with the jubilee celebrations to be held in February next, was approved, and Professor Darnley Naylor was appointed to represent the University on the occasion. On the recommendation of the Faculty of Music, it was resolved that if a sufficient number of students applied, arrangements should be made for evening classes in the theory of music at the Conservatorium. The report of the Extension Lectures Committee recommending that lectures should be resumed in 1920 was approved. It is proposed that the undermentioned courses should be given:—"The Conquest of Nature," by Professor Bradford Robertson; "The Insectal Community," by Sir Douglas Mawson; "The Teaching of Robert Browning," by Professor Henderson.

NEW LAWYERS.
ADMISSIONS TO THE BAR.
 Saturday being the last day of the final law term for 1919, the Full Court, consisting of the Chief Justice (Sir George Murray), Mr. Justice Gordon, Mr. Justice Buchanan, and Mr. Justice Poole, sat for the transaction of formal business.
 Sir Josiah Cymon, K.C., moved for the admission of Mr. A. J. L. Sutherland. He said Mr. Sutherland was articled to Mr. T. S. O'Halloran in March, 1914. A year later he enlisted and served with the forces for three and a half years. He returned in March last, and completed his articles.
 Mr. Sutherland, who is 22 years of age, is a son of Mr. H. W. Sutherland, of Unley. He was educated at Kyre College, and was top of his form each year of his course, and finally was dux of the school.
 Dr. F. W. Richards (Crown Solicitor) moved for the admission of Mr. G. J. Ziesing. He mentioned that Mr. Ziesing had served his articles in the Crown Law Office. He enlisted for active service on

Partial Exemption from Rule.
 Mr. Angus Parsons moved that an exemption from the requirements of Rule 6, of the Supreme Court—under which students are required to pass the Senior Public Examination (including Latin), before they enter on articles as law clerks—be granted to Mr. L. Brisbane Matthews, who desired to enter into articles as a law clerk. He said Mr. Matthews, who was 23 years of age, was an officer of the court engaged in the Master's Office. In 1911 he passed the junior examination in five subjects. He had subsequently passed the public senior in Latin, and had prepared for the English literature examination; when he enlisted in November, 1915; was away for about two and half years. On March 10, this year he resumed his duties in the Master's Office.
 Mr. C. A. Edmunds, on behalf of the Law Society, opposed the application for the granting of complete exemption from the rule, but intimated that the society would not object to an extension of time being allowed Mr. Matthews in which to pass in the necessary subjects.
 The court, made an order that the applicant should be exempt from the necessity of passing the whole of the five subjects other than Latin and English literature, but that he would be required to pass in three subjects before being admitted as a practitioner. They gave leave that he might enter on his articles at once.
 At a meeting of the council of the Adelaide University on Friday the appointments were approved as assistant teachers in singing of Misses Hilda E. Gill, A.M.U.A., and Myrtle L. Ingham, A.M.U.A., Mrs. Victor Cromer has been appointed teacher of diction and department in the Elder Conservatorium. Miss Nancy E. Winnall has been awarded the recently founded Research Scholarship in Botany.
