UNIVERSITY STUDENTS AND WAR SERVICE.

At the University commemoration in December the Chancellor referred to the creation of the Australian Administrative Committee, which was dealing with matters connected with the movement in England for the education of soldiers during demobilisation. The Australian Universities, recognising that a considerable time would necessarily elapse before students on active service could return from Europe, drew up a scheme for the continuation of their education while on active service, and placed it before the defence authorities, who expressed approval of it. The idea is that facilities shall be given for Australian university students who have qualified for matriculation or who have broken their course, to attend suitable classes in one of the British universities or other institutions of university rank, and that such courses shall be recognised by their own universities as qualifying for degrees. With the sanction of the Federal Government the Administrative Committee, which consists of Assistant Professor Holme, of Sydney University; Mr. H. W. Allen, of Melbourne University; and Lieutenant E. V. Clark, of the Adelaide University, will have its headquarters at the office of the Bureau of the Universities of the Empire, in the Imperial Institute, London, and will get into touch with students whose embarkation is delayed and send them to universities to continue their undergraduate courses as far as possible. It is understood that the authorities at the English universities will give the scheme all the help in their power, and the experience gained by the students will be of great value to them.

EDUCATION OF SOLDIERS.

Interesting Scheme Explained.

Concerning the work of the A.I.F. Education Service of which Bishop Long of Bathurst (who has spent a good deal of time among our troops at the front and in England) is the director, an interesting letter has been published in The West Australian (Perth) from Lieut. Campbell Hendry, formerly a commercial student in the Adelaide University, and now Lecturer on Applied Accountancy and Bookkeeping in connection with the A.I.F. at Cambridge University. Lieut. Hendry writes:—

This Education Service for our troops is a definite part of the military service, somewhat analogous to the Medical Service. From Gen. Birdwood down the heads are fully seized of its importance and the great possibilities that lie before it. All the armies in the field have been tackling the same problem. Canada has had its Khaki University in operation for about 18 months. The New Zealand scheme has been in operation about seven months. The Americans, with their usual foresight, commenced right from the jump off. The British Army already has schools for the instruction of its teachers. It is an unique experiment, this determined attempt to tackle the problem of adult education. You in Australia must do your part, but exactly what you are to do, and how, you must search out for yourselves. Our scheme has got this far:—1. A census proportionally representative of all services in the A.I.F. has been taken to ascertain broadly the requirements of the men. An analysis revealed that of those who desired instruction about 27 per cent. various forms of agricultural pursuits, about 35 per cent. various trades and crafts, about 35 per cent. commercial subjects, about 10 per cent. elementary and general, about 30 per cent. professional. This is only a broad generalization, and one or two little things must be borne in mind. Many farmers have indicated their desire to take courses in farming side lines, so to speak, for example, motor engineering, so as to be able to intelligently handle common internal combustion engines; bookkeeping, so as to be able to keep their own books, and so on; and the same applies to other vocations. So please do not jump to the conclusion that about 25 per cent. of the A.I.F. are desirous of entering into commercial life when they return. As a matter of fact, I am personally of opinion that most of the diggers will prefer some open-air vocation.

—Text Books and Classes.—

2. We have here congregated experts of various kinds, 54 in all, who have had the scheme put before them, its great advantages, its great difficulties, and so on, and these men have carefully drawn up a syllabus per each subject in the prospectus, and have recommended suitable text books. When these are printed copies will be sent to the universities. Now there will probably be some adverse criticism of the text books selected. Point out to such critics that we have had to bear in mind the following governing conditions:—They had to be (a) small and portable, (b) as inexpensive as possible, (c) owing to war conditions and the great demand, owing to others being in the field as buyers, too, the probable difficulty of being able to get the books. Reference books for the libraries have also been recommended, governing conditions (a) above, we disregarded, but (b) and (c) had still to be remembered. 3. The following universities have promised to give us an allotment to enable suitable selected men to attend various courses. Remember, they expect to be overtaxed by the demands of their own men in the British forces after the demobilization commences. It is typical, however, of the genuine desire of the home people to help all "dominions" soldiers and sailors, and is expressive in its way of the very high regard in which they hold all men from all the dominions. Oxford, Cambridge, Birmingham, London, Glasgow, Edinburgh, Manchester, Liverpool, and others, and also the leading technical schools and colleges, Manchester, Glasgow, &c. 4. The education service has communicated with all the Australian universities with the object of securing recognition by them of certificates issued by the E. Service. Examinations and examiners, &c., to be approved by the universities. This also applies to accountants' institutes, licensed land surveyors, and architects' institutes, and similar bodies. We have not yet had time to get replies.

5. A report on the repatriation proposals has been drawn up, and as much information as possible secured of the proposals of the Commonwealth and States. These have been issued to us. Then, after these have gone, to send those for whom you have work, say, shearers are wanted, and you cable 500 shearers Western Australia. What evidence will you require that they are shearers? Will you have them nominated from your end? Do you guarantee that they will be able to go straight to a job? You must also remember that almost every man will go home and have a real spell for a time; there is a very real heart hunger among the diggers to get to their own homes, and do as they like. To get
