Dr. Davy at quite an early age showed great natural ability for music, both practical and theoretical. It is interesting to note that a phrenologist, who saw her at the age of five, predicted the career that she was to follow by remarking to her mother, "Here is a professional musician and composer."

During childhood her pianoforte playing attracted much attention, and many musicians foretold for her a brilliant future. She devoted herself first to study for the A.M.U.A. diploma, which she gained in 1903, being the first student to take composition as the principal subject.

Asked about her platform performances, Dr. Davy said she appeared fairly often in solo and ensemble playing prior to entering upon the Mus. Bacc. course, but she found then that it was not possible to give the same attention to both practical and theoretical work.
