

THE EXAMINATION SYSTEM.

From "STUDENT":—I agree with E.W.P. that there is need for much improvement in the examinations, but I do not think it is just to fasten the blame on the University professors, who, I am certain, are quite as alive to the defects of the present system and quite as anxious for improvement as E.W.P. can be.

To show that the University is endeavoring to bring the method of examination up to date, I may mention that a two years' notice has been issued to teachers of mathematics that after that period of time the mathematical examinations will be in accordance with the modern method of teaching that most important branch of education.
