### EDUCATION.

From "CULTURE, NOT CRAM":—"E. W. P." asks, "Is our University teaching obsolete?" It may be said that it is following the usage of most universities with reference to what may be called the preliminary culture; and, unless there are among the professors in the Adelaide University a mind capable of great initiative, we can hardly expect the younger university will find a change of method. On the other hand, the usual university method stands in enormous need of improvement. There ought to be opportunity to ask questions for the solution of difficult points. There ought to be a means of securing interest in studies for their own sake, and scope for originality. There ought to be opportunity for real education—the drawing out of the powers within the student. There should be a change from the dreary process of being stuffed, instead of the joy of spontaneous discovery and exhibition. But how are these things to be done? With all their drawbacks, our universities are of enormous influence for the good of mankind. However, the universities have the key to a better method than that which they chiefly employ; they have research work, and students of research work. In research work the student sets his powers to work to find out and give expression to knowledge. He applies and receives advice and guidance, and help at difficult points from the professors; but he has to think on the subject himself, and then at the appointed time to prepare a thesis. The student is judged not by answers to questions, but by his thesis, from which his examiners estimate the degree and efficiency of his knowledge. All this is an enormously superior process to the method of cram and memoriter work, and gives real education. European educators of the highest rank urge that the method of dealing with all students should be brought much more into line with research work, and thus would be evolved, in the language of "E. W. P.," "a system of university education more human, more humane, and more effective." It would be a great acknowledgment if the Adelaide University takes a lead in this matter.

### NEW RESEARCH ENTERPRISE.

Recently £7,000 was subscribed by citizens for the assistance of the University of Adelaide in research on the growth and nutrition of man and animals. At a meeting of the senate of the University on Wednesday it was agreed that the University should provide an annual income of £500 in respect to the endowment, and that a director should be appointed to a laboratory to conduct the research. It was also resolved that the title and general purpose of the endowment should not be changed during the lifetime of the original subscribers without the consent of a majority of them.
