Chapman, of the Adelaide University and President of the Institution of Engineers, Australia, is at present touring the States of the Commonwealth, and addressing meetings under the auspices of the State divisions of the institution, with the object of arousing the interest of the engineering profession and manufacturers generally in the important rational question of establishing standards in the production of many material necessities of life, and in the aims and objects of the recently formed Commonwealth Engineering Standards Association. The main committee of this association includes one representative of the State Government, three representatives of the Australian Chemical Institute, three representatives of the Australian Institute of Mining and Metallurgy, and six members of the Institution of Engineers, Australia.
