DEATH OF DR. J. W. LEITCH .- Dr. J. W. DEATH OF DR. J. W. LETCH.—Dr. J. W. Leitch died at his parents' residence, Angastrees, early on Monday morning, the cause of death being consumption, which supervened on a neglected attack of influenza in February last. The deceased gentleman had an exceptionally brilliant career as a scholar. Born in May, 1867, J. W. Leitch at an early ago gave evidence of the possession of exceptional gave strictics of the possession of exceptional staleats. In December, 1878, when eleven years old, he took an exhibition scholar-ship of £30 per year for three years at the Grobe-street State School. In December, 1879, he passed the primary examination at the University, and in Decomber, 1880, he matriculated first class with honours, and took the foundation scholarship at Prince Alfred College. Following up his success he took the University Scholarship stackes no cook tin University Scholarship of E00 per years in March of E00 per years in March of 1892. His next achievement was at be winning of the South Australian Scholarship of E200 per annum for four years when only seventeen years of age. The hand to be supported to the year in the period of the year in which he also sourced his B.A. degree. Pro-ceeding to Europe he, in July, 1883, took the M.B. and Oh.M. degrees at Edin-burgh at the age of twenty-two. Dr. Listich practised three years at Kadina, and nearly a year at Orroco. He sarred the esteem of all who knew him, and was much shought of among the medical profession, who recognised him as a devotee of science for its own make and not for the horse. own sake and not for the hope of pecuniary reward or the acquirement of honours. Dr. Leitch and was one of his close personal friends, says that the deceased was a clearheaded man, a solid thinker, and very logical.
