

Subsequently, in subscriptions and bequests, Sir Thomas Elder gave the University £S0,000. He endowed Chairs in Mathematics and Natural Science (£20,000), a medical school (£30,000). and school of music (£20,000), as well as making an endowment for general purposes (£25,000), contributing towards a chair of music (£1,500), and providing £1,000 in 1888-9 to enable the council to establish a full medical curriculum.
