I have obtained a Ministry of Labour permit, which seems to be as offensively worded as most such documents, but which I hope will meet the case.

I am sending this letter by Air Mail in the hope of catching you before you leave California, for I am not sure at what date you travel but I am sending the permit to the British Consulate in New York, City, asking that it shall be kept to await your application about the 1st November .

I have secured a number of living British Grouse Locusts of the Genese, which the British Antimologists called Teotrics, which is I think, equivalent to the American Genese Acoryclaum. I am quite anxious to be able to breed these successfully next year.
