TEACHING CATS TO SAY C-A-T

ADELAIDE, Saturday.

Scientists will teach cats, dogs and monkeys to talk, Sir Ronald Fisher, the British geneticist, predicted in Adelaide today. Sir Ronald is on a lecture tour.

"Surgery of brain and mouth, followed by intensive training, should enable these animals to speak simple sentences," he said. "These advances are likely to occur in our time. One day, every family will have an intelligent monkey as a servant. The monkey might also be taught to work in factories."—Associated Press
