Dear Bill,

I have written to Oliver & Boyd about your application for the use of the table of  $t$  in the second and subsequent editions of your book on Experimental Designs, and of course we shall be glad to give you and Gertrude the permission you ask for. The ordinary conditions are that of mentioning the source on the page on which the table is printed and in the preface, and of sending Oliver & Boyd two copies of the work and of any subsequent editions containing the table. I hope these will not be at all troublesome.

I do not know whether you have noticed that in Statistical Tables the table of  $t$  is rather fuller, through the inclusion of lines for 40, 60 and 120 degrees of freedom, and of a new column for 0.1%. Actually I have never added these trimmings to the table printed in the book.
