Dear Darlington,

Thanks for sending the papers. I should be inclined to send Winge the manuscript so that he can answer our questions as he thinks best, though alterations could, of course, be put in the proofs if you think this will save Oliver & Boyd time.

I am returning the other three papers herewith. I agree that Dobzhansky might well give graphs representing his tables. I think also you are right in being willing to print Frankel's two papers,

though there is not much in them. The second one on wheat selection is the point in showing that a few people in New Zealand are thinking about the problem and that they have so far made no particular progress.
