Hany thanks for your letter of Merch 1st. and for what you say about my memorandum. Genetic work in Cambridge has become so dispersed and dissociated from the Phair of Genetics that it would, I think, be impossible to plan at once my closely co-ordinated traching of the subject.

I shall be most enxious, as arrangements advance and possibilities become cleares, to associate the Chair, if it is affered to me, with a continuous series of studies in Medical Genetics such as we were

doing at the balton Laboratory, and which, as the emergence of the Rhesus-factor has shown, cannot with advantage be abandoned, even during the war.

I will get Taylor to try to arrange a meeting with you, if I may, when next we are together in Cambridge.
