My dear Henry,

Many thanks for your letter of October 20th. I am writing at once to let you know that I have not received the long letter you tell me was written from the Scillies.

I have also no specific news of the Moniola paper, though I have begun to receive parts of volume 2 number 3, so far only one paper. For my own part I should like the journal to be quite comprehensive, but I do not believe this can be done at our present rate of publication. Only yesterday Race was asking about putting on permanent record 250 donors grouped simultaneously in all known factors, apart from secretion, and I just do not know whether Darlington will think Heredity is the right place for essentially repository material. I had aimed deliberately, when running the Annals, at making this use of that journal, which was, of course, entirely in accordance with the Galton Laboratory tradition. However, I told Rob that he ought to put it to Darlington himself, and that I would support it if Darlington thought it not unsuitable.

Thanks also for your news about Michie and your plans for animal accommodation. I saw Mather yesterday, who seems in good spirits about his progress at Birmingham.
