My dear Ron,

Your letter sent on from Street has reached me in Oxford today. Thank you indeed for all you have done. I am distressed, however, to hear that the data do not check. I suppose I must have made some stupid mistakes in copying from the originals which are here. I am so sorry. I will go carefully through and see what has happened.

I leave on August 10<sup>th</sup> (Sunday next) for Comwall, where I make preliminary collections on the mainland opposite the Lundy Isles before going on there at the end of next week.

I should the proofs of our dominula paper arrive now, would you be so good as to go through them, as suggested when we were

together? If sent to Comwall they might  
miss me, or arrive only a day or so  
before I leave for my Island, when it would  
be difficult to deal with them. On the  
island itself, I can neither receive nor send  
letters.

I understand you go to the U.S.A.  
towards the end of August. If the proofs  
arrive after that, they must await my  
return; but as I get back on September 4<sup>th</sup>  
there would not be a long delay.

Should you be dealing with them,  
would you kindly order 175 reprints for  
me (if that is not too many)?

So sorry to bother you with the  
possibility of proofs, but it is difficult when  
going to an uninhabited island.
