My dear Ron,

Thank you so much for the redraft  
of paragraphs 15 & 16 of our summary. They  
are a decided improvement, so I hope you will  
substitute them for my draft: I return them  
herewith.

I heard from Darlington this  
morning, and enclose his letter for you to see  
(I have taken a note of the details). So this  
seems nicely arranged, and it will be a  
material advantage to have one paper illustrated  
with a colour plate.

I am writing today to Braufoy -  
who is I believe the man best qualified to do  
the work, and I remember you were in  
agreement with the suggestion that I should  
approach him. I think we might well keep  
to our original suggestion of 4 specimens, which

Should fit the space quite nicely, for there is considerable advantage in showing one of the less, and one of the more, extreme heterozygotes.

I quite agree with all you say about Race, and you know how delighted I shall be to sign the certificate. I feel sure that Hardy will gladly do so and I will, in addition, mention the matter to him myself.

Will let you know as soon as I hear from Braufog.
