My dear Henry,

I had a visit yesterday from Taylor and Race and we were able to discuss the programme for the Addcliffe Infirmary. I found them inclined to speculate, as is now natural, that perhaps a large proportion of deaths at or about birth are due to the rhesus factor. I encouraged them to consider testing all infants for rhesus. I think they can manage it now, as many cases of icterus gravis have been brought to their notice. They are also inclined to explore the possibility of getting other Maternity Hospital material in Cambridge. This would be nothing but an advantage if they fit it in conveniently to their ordinary week's work.
