

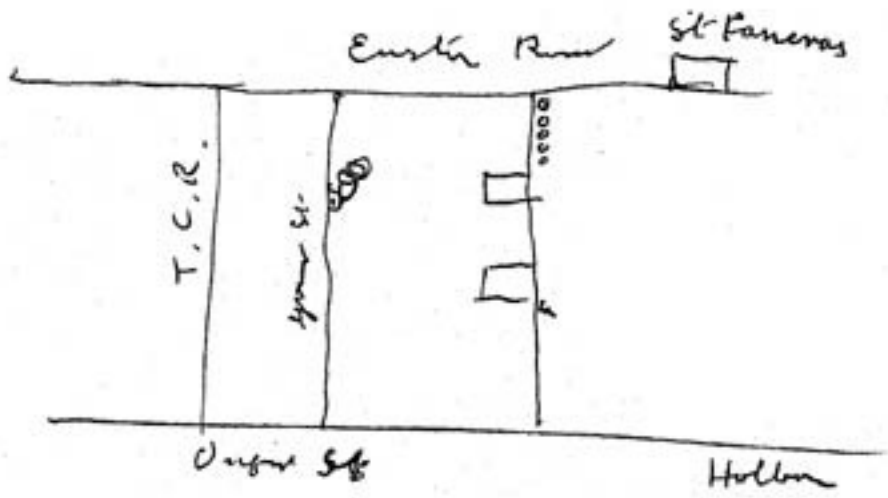

My dear Fisher,

All well, I shall get

In addition to the slides
you saw I have have two more
made illustrating (1) melanosis in
which the melanin form is darker



than the typical and (2) a minimal
polymorphism which gives a 2:1 ratio
where one of 3:1 is anticipated. I
think a nice story can be made of each.

whose camera was used in de Beers
Department had gone away. They told
me when we decided that another
slide or two would be well, and
column is not required to bring out
the necessary points in either of these
two cases. There are full-sized
slides, so will your ordinary lantern
be available in addition to the
