My dear Fisher,

Here are the details as to the  
wanted from Plymouth in regard to heterozygotes  
in nature. As you will see it is unfortunately  
defective in certain important respects - ~~the~~  
~~consequence~~ of the 10 eye-colour genes  
some remained untested, so as do not know  
whether these are distinct genes or not.

The data at Plymouth is not  
always in a very available form. I therefore thought it  
best to send you the letter and list which I  
received from Spooner (who works with Mr. Sexton),  
for you may be able to extract more from it  
than I can. Though on the whole it seems pretty  
clear. May I have it back some time - there is  
no hurry.
