Dear Garwood,

I was interested to read your paper, which I am returning herewith, with a few marginal notes which I hope won't spoil the copy for your own use. On pp. 2 and 10 there are notes referring to the little note I wrote for Bliss, published as an appendix to his 1935 paper, in which I show that the maximum likelihood solution requires the use of fictitious, or working, probits in all cases, though the empirical probits supply the working approximation except where all or none survive.

The process is an instructive one, and I hope your paper may make it more familiar to many people who might be using it, or something analogous in their own problems.
