Dear Fisher,

I went through the article of Baker and also read again your Toronto paper. I think that Baker had, at least, to quote your paper as well as yours Statistical Methods. It seems difficult to me that it could ignore both yours works and, for that reason, I am sending back to him the manuscript of another article that he had submitted for the next number of "Metron". I have already explained to you how the inconvenience might arise. As a matter of fact, I have now two assistants who are very good mathematicians but have not yet an adequate knowledge of the statistical literature. To one of them I have specially recommended to read your works and, for this purpose, I will be very obliged to you if you could send to me again for a month the typewritten article by Romanowsky that you sent to me on January 28, 1937 and that I sent back at the beginning of 1938. As a matter of fact, I had given it to study to my ancient assistant who died suddenly last year. He had also taken some notes from it, but after his death it was not possible to find them.

I have read now the article by Stevens on "Estimation of blood-group gene frequencies" and I am writing to him and calling his attention to my article published in "Genus", Vol.I, N° 3/4, April 1935. I think that Stevens is always in your Laboratory. If not so, please forward to him

my letter.
