You may remember some time ago there was a certain amount of trouble with the Secretary of the Cambridge Philosophical Society about the test of significance put forward by a man called Behrens, which, though not often wanted, appeared to me to be correctly treated by that author, so far as the results obtained are concerned. Bartlett had made a number of objections to this test. Most of these seem now to have been withdrawn, but in giving fuller tables of Behrens' integral, I have taken the opportunity of examining them in relation to other cases of statistical influence.
