I am glad to hear that you will be in England soon.

On the point you raise, I suppose that Residual effects are not your prime object of enquiry, and that the second crop yields will tell you all you want to know from this series of experiments. In that case I see no objection at all to re-randomisation of the same plots. Of course should long term residual effects prove to be important, these will contribute to the estimate of error in later years, and so cut down precision; but this will not in any way affect the validity of your comparisons.
