I have just received your letter and the present, which I am sure will give a great deal of pleasure. Your Africans sound to be full of enterprise of every sort. I have one in the Department just now and hope the English climate will not freeze him.

Almost at once I shall be going to Italy to give a series of talks at Luca Cavalli's Biometric Seminar, this year at Varenna. I shall be talking almost entirely about the logic of uncertain inference rather than on the two other topics which engage us most, namely statistical analysis and experimental design. However, there are floating about in the literature enough logical misconceptions to be worth a certain amount of careful examination.

Anyway it will be a pleasure to see Luca and his friends again. I am sending this to Belgium as I do not know how long you will be in the Congo.
