My dear Rob,

Thank you for the splendid long letter you have written me about the position with Glancy. With respect to the extent to which it should be regarded as confidential, I should like your further advice. Early this term I included the general four-point theory of the Rhesus factor in material for my Part II class. I do not suppose that any spy of Wiener's was present and I fear that probably nothing at all stuck, but I shall be talking again at various times this year, at Manchester next week and in Australia and it is nice to be able to give news about scientific progress whenever this can be done without objection. I hope I shall be back by about May 10th, and shall be able to consult you before saying anything, as I might be tempted to do, in the Croonian Lecture at the Royal, where, under the general title of "Population Genetics" I should hope to say a good deal about what the blood groups have done for Human Genetics.

I suppose you could not say yet that the proportion of F in R_0 is significantly less than the ten per cent or so arrived at by dead reckoning. Are your two cases of R_y combined with r and R_1 respectively from the same family?
