Dear Sir,

I have your note of September 19th. and the supplementary information of September 24th. concerning the S15. B. G. in the Serological Research Account which I opened some time ago.

The situation is that a serological research unit was founded under my direction when I was Galton Professor at University College by the benefaction of the Rockefeller Committee. In 1939 this unit

was taken over by the Medical Research Council and employed by them in the School of Pathology at Cambridge until some time in the summer of 1946, when Dr. Race moved to his present position in the Lister Institute. I have, therefore, at present no official connection with the work which the benefaction was intended to further, and as this work, substantially in continuity with what I started, is still being carried on, I think it would be proper, subject to your concurrence, for me to transfer the residue to Dr. Race's research account. If you see no objection to this course I expect that a cheque for the total will be presented for payment.
