Many thanks for your letter of 18 August. I do not know what success you had with Fischer and Schweizerbart, but I expect they will be pretty hard to move at the present time.

I have nearly complete material of the length of about a chapter, on the various objections which have from time to time been raised on Selection theory. I think this should not be uninteresting because the logical and historical examination of these objections are mutually rather illuminating.

I am very sorry that the work which you have put in should seem at the moment frustrated, but I feel a good deal more confident than I did, that a German Edition will be necessary, as I have since heard from various sources, including my Publishers, that the book has been in England, a good deal more successful than I had thought.
