 COMMERCIAL GEOGRAPHY.

From A. A. SIMPSON, President of the Royal Geographical Society of Australasia:—I much regret to hear that last week the Senate of the University of Adelaide decided to remove geography from the curriculum of the Diploma of Commerce course. Considering the relatively enormous trade of Australia, it might have been known that there are practical advantages in commercial geography, and that an exact knowledge of the markets whence we derive manufactures, or to which we export our productions is of substantial utility. And some catholicity of view is expected from a university. Everywhere else in the world the importance of geography is becoming increasingly recognised, and the study of this subject actively extended. If the diploma of commerce is to become a diploma of accountability only, like those of the various accounts corporations which admit new members on examination, then the name of the diploma should be changed accordingly. I am told that in some American universities similar commercial courses are equally confined in their subjects. There are, however, various kinds of universities in the United States, and a reduction in the value of the curriculum would not commend itself to all. America is certainly advanced in the mechanical department of accountancy, but ignorance in America is not more meritorious or profitable than it is here. It would be interesting to know how many tons of futile advertising matter is sent to the Commonwealth annually by American merchants who are ignorant of what is suitable for our climate and conditions. But neglect of geography cannot be charged against the better American universities, and some American geographical text books—like Russel Smith's industrial geography—have a circulation throughout the English-speaking world. Melbourne and Sydney Universities include geography in their commercial curriculum, and are not likely to retrograde. If the object of our University authorities is to make the Adelaide diploma of commerce the easiest of attainment in Australia, that result can be got without difficulty, but it would be deplorable if those responsible for our admirable science course should attempt to reach a similar bad eminence. I sincerely trust that the alteration may be reconsidered and that the standard of culture heretofore required for the business diploma may be restored.
