MODERN EDUCATION.

"TOO MANY SUBJECTS TAUGHT."

A protest against the cramming of school children with a multiplicity of subjects and a plea for fewer subjects, which could be more easily digested and more thoroughly taught, were made by Archdeacon Moyes, at the speech day of Pattoonga School, St. Peters, on Wednesday evening. He said it seemed as though there was a spirit of impatience abroad and that in the world of education there was a tendency to forget the real meaning of the education they were trying to give the children. Although he had himself to be a layman in the matter he considered that the education curriculum should have two main objects, first to give children the power to think and to estimate values in life, and, secondly, to

help them to have a capacity for using their leisure in after years. Education, therefore, should not be so much a matter of cramming as of training the child to think and also to love learning.

Year by year, he said, the curriculum was growing more crowded. There was obviously something wrong with a system which tended to a state in which children were anxious to throw away their books and forget them. He found that children to-day were asked to cover such an amazingly wide range of subjects that it was a tremendous strain on child life, and it was difficult to learn any subject properly. There was so much in the year's curriculum that teachers had not time to teach the subjects properly, and he knew children whose evenings were a misery to them, striving in their homework over subjects which had been all too little explained. The school system was one under which a child had no time for mental development, but only for cramming, and that made the children, except the brilliant ones, hate their studies. It would be well if they could persuade the University, which was the chief sinner in those matters, to arrange things so that children would be taught fewer subjects, which could be more truly digested, and allow real mind training and better mental development. He wanted a curriculum which would help children to have the power to think; he wanted children when they left school to look upon the day they left as a "commencement day" from which the love of reading, the love of music, the love of art, and the love of learning could be carried on right through their lives.

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50-BUSHEL CROPS AT URRBRAE.

Wunderly.

According to reports submitted to the Department of Agriculture, wheat plots at Urrbrae, cultivated under direction of Dr. A. E. V. Richardson (Director of the Waite Institute) are yielding 40 to 50 bushels to the acre. It is expected that harvesting will be completed to-day. Dr. Richardson states that the results are highly satisfactory, for yields of all cereals are heavier than anticipated earlier in the season. Crops at Urrbrae had suffered the same disabilities so far as incidence of rainfall was concerned, as had crops in other parts of the State. "It would take five or six weeks to tabulate all results, but then it would be possible to tell practical farmers what had been done, and the results, of special methods of cultivation, manuring, and other work inseparable from agricultural pursuits.
